REDS FROM SPAIN

In terms of wines, León is synonymous with Prieto Picudo. Our region enjoys the exclusivity of this type of grape, with its small, tight clusters and spiky vines, as its name suggests. Prieto Picudo grows comfortably on the heights of the León plateau, which in some areas exceeds 800 metres, where rain is not abundant and the temperature can vary twenty degrees between day and night; this last factor, besides helping to keep potential problems at bay, causes a greater concentration of acidity and slows down the ripening process.

Here in El Capricho, filled with our grandparents' and great-grandparents' passion for wine, we have spent years trying to recover the same vineyards that they created in their time; old Prieto Picudo vines as well as Mencía, Garnacha and a little Palomino. They are goblet-pruned vines that are difficult to grow and require great effort, but when planted in this marvellous Leonese clay and gravel soil, give wines of great delicacy and elegance, with their wonderful touch of acidity.

Geni González: The Prieto Picudo grape gives rustic wines in León, with great personality and with a lot of life ahead.

Where Leon comes to an end, and Galicia is not there yet, we find El Bierzo tucked into a border region that also produces border wines, embedded between the rains on one side and the drought and thermal swings on the other, and it is precisely this characteristic which explains the dependence of these wines on the climate. Grapes in El Bierzo grow in a mild microclimate that combines the best of both worlds, the Atlantic and the continental, although sometimes the vines lean more towards one side or the other, which explains that some vintages are very warm and others cold. The area is dotted with small towns that began to make a living from wine when they abandoned mining, and started to grow the vines of the region, where the standard grape, the Mencía, expresses itself elegantly in wines with a big personality.

On the finger of a doctor / Set in gold I saw / A
very fine ruby, / Because this colour is always / The

/ Did I do wrong ?

The liquid ruby which Luis de Góngora alludes to in his poem and which he apparently resorted to for his melancholy have been mined for many centuries, before the arrival of the Romans, in the lands of Zamora, where the more serene Duero begins to say goodbye to Spain, before entering the gorges of Los Arribes and onwards to Portugal. The extreme continental climate of the region marks the powerful character of these wines made from the red grape varieties of Toro and Garnacha, which grow in sandy soils in an arid landscape that hardly sees rain from one end of the year to the other. It is precisely this characteristic that saved their vineyards from the devastating plague of phylloxera that affected Europe at the beginning of the 20th century, so that some vineyards of great antiquity survive in the area. Power, hardiness and body have been synonymous for centuries with these low-growing wines, and it is said that they were among those taken to the New World on Columbus' first voyage. True or not, their strong personality is beyond doubt.

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The River Douro rises in Soria and is still flowing impetuously when it courses through the Ribera's vineyards, the first on its route, before softening as it passes through Rueda and Valladolid, and narrowing at its entry into Portugal. The grapes have learned to defend themselves in this region, to protect themselves from the dramatic temperature changes that occur here between day and night, with variations that can reach 25°C or 30°C in the warm months. This is precisely the secret of the Ribera del Duero wines; this thermal contrast that has given the grapes a strong, sturdy skin to combat the external aggressions of this extreme continental climate, so that they naturally produce concentrated wines with good acidity, if they work well.

Until just a few decades ago the El Priorat region had practically been forgotten by the world of wine, and if you looked to Catalonia it was to focus on the Penedès and its wineries. However, this region of Tarragona once had great wine-making importance, going back to the twelfth century when Carthusian monks settled in the region, bringing with them the knowledge and techniques to grow vines and make wine. The great prestige it enjoys today began in the 80s thanks to the arrival in the area of winemakers such as Álvaro Palacios, René Barbier and Josep Lluís Pérez, who insisted on recovering the old vines and extracting the best fruit from the licorellas (slate soils) and the warm days and cold nights of the Mediterranean climate of Tarragona. Now rescued from oblivion forever, El Priorat has managed to carve out unimaginable international renown in only thirty years.

The great historical wine-making area of Spain has its roots in the era of Roman domination, but it was in the nineteenth century when there were two developments that marked its modern character. One was when the Álavan provincial government hired the French winemaker Jean Pinneau, who began to apply the Bordeaux method under the label of “Álavan Médoc”. Although the project did not quite come to fruition, his successful subsequent work for the Marquis de Riscal was imitated by other winemakers and made the method popular. The other was that the ravages that phylloxera was causing in France led French merchants to search desperately for wine in Rioja Alta, to meet the demand of their customers. These two factors came together to build a success story that has come down to the modern day, when Rioja is a world-wide brand that now faces other challenges, one of the greatest of which is to give voice to its most unique vineyards, those capable of expressing the specific place where they are and radically distinguish themselves from other wineries they share the region with.

Today it is one of the largest producers of wine worldwide and undoubtedly the one that produces them at highest altitudes —there are vineyards located over a thousand, more than two thousand and even more than three thousand metres above sea level— and it has enriched its wine knowledge with experience and traditions imported from other latitudes. A country of emigrants, Argentina has also been a host country for immigrants when, for various reasons, Italians, French, Germans, Spaniards and Portuguese arrived, many of them bringing with them the nostalgia of the wines they had left behind. As a result of this mix of different wine cultures, Argentina's own wine tradition was built, and today, thanks to travel and the curiosity of current generations, there is beginning to be a transition between the more industrialised, mass-produced wines which they made in the past, to smaller, more carefully-produced vintages that augur a very interesting future.

The natural barriers of the Pacific Ocean, the Atacama desert and the Andes mountain range, which make Chile a kind of walled territory on all sides, have contributed to the fact that it was the only country that was not affected by the phylloxera plague, and it still enjoys vineyards planted free standing (vines that are not grafted), which distinguishes it from other wine-producing countries. As we see in Argentina, the new generations of wine growers are striving to produce unique, personal vintages that stand out from the large commercially-produced wines.

At first it seems easy. The wine enters smoothly, slips into the mouth stealthily, without making a noise, as if unwilling to disturb. This discretion may encourage the suspicion that its journey will be short, that the pleasure will be brief, that it will not take long to leave your palate and your memory. But nothing could be further from the truth: the wines of Burgundy aspire to eternity. The Pinot Noir grape that makes them possible does not provide colour or structure, it does not offer obvious pleasures, but do not let yourself be fooled by its apparent lightness. Once they enter the mouth, they begin to grow. And then they keep on growing. And they will not stop. The elegant majesty of a Burgundy brings infinite nuances and subtle, unexpected sensations. Since the Middle Ages, when the monks were owners and lords of the vineyards, to the restructuring brought by the French Revolution, to this day, Burgundy has always gone its own way, keeping faith with its principles, regardless of criticism and fashions and without the need for defenders, asserting its greatness in its own right.

Paco Berciano: There are wines that work like fireworks; they flood the sky, but they fizzle out very quickly. Drinking a Burgundy, on the other hand, is like sitting under a starry sky and taking your time to admire each star.

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The dubious reputation of the so-called 'Beaujolais nouveau', the very young wine that appears every November on French tables just a few weeks after the Gamay grape harvest, has undermined the wines of this region until very recently, as it became identified with vulgar, cheap wine. Nowadays, however, thanks among other things to climate change, which means the grapes ripen more quickly, and the low prices of the vineyards compared to other areas, this has become a region of great potential. The new claim of freshness as a virtue has also favoured these quaffable 'vins de soif', as the French label them; they are refreshing, cheerful, easy to drink and suitable to quench one's thirst, and they can be a magnificent counterpoint to the fat and the unctuous texture of red meat.

When we think of the Loire Valley, we imagine fairy-tale castles, their impeccably shaded gardens reflecting the old splendour of French royalty and aristocracy. But right by their side, over many centuries, another story has been written; that of the peasants, that of the families of small farmers who have worked the same vineyards for generations and made this region one of the most interesting from France within the world of wine. The Loire is long and its route is flanked by vineyards almost from the beginning to the end, with wines in general of good acidity and not much body, which change as the river flows; at the beginning of its course, by Sancerre and Pouilly, we find white wines with a great capacity to age; in the central part the big red wines are made and upon arrival in the Nantes area, with the Atlantic almost in sight, the wines become cooler, more affordable and more immediate, but always with that good acidity guaranteed by the cold climate.

The Rhône Valley is where the wines of south-eastern France are made. The area of vineyards starts south of Lyon, around Vienne, and extends to Arles, where the river flows after passing through Avignon, the seat of the papacy in much of the fourteenth century; this was when local viticulture began to take off, thanks especially to Pope John XXII. In the northern half of its course, the Rhône flows through a landscape of deep slopes, granite and slate soils and wonderful terraced vineyards, mainly of the Syrah grape. The climate is still continental and cool in this area and so are its wines, which maintain a good balance between acidity and structure. The southern half, with a milder climate, gives the first clearly Mediterranean wines of France, warmer and more concentrated, in areas where sands and boulders appear and the varieties are more diverse.

In the northwest of Italy, at 'the foot of the mountain', in the shadow of the Italian Alps and a stone's throw from the Apennines, between churches, mansions and castles lost in the mist grows the Nebbiolo, the grape of the mist, mother of the Barbaresco and one of the great wines of the world; the Barolo. This is a wine in constant battle against time, whose demands it stubbornly refuses, always struggling to remain young, refusing outright to grow old. And yet... when it opens up, when it finally offers itself, it is a majestic wine, with a depth that is difficult to find elsewhere. And if it finally reaches old age, it has an incomparable flavour.

As in so many other areas, in wine we are also too accustomed to turning our backs on our neighbours in the west of the Peninsula, despite the undoubted interest of the area in this field. From the power of Douro to the elegant rusticity of Bairrada, of the subtlety of Dão to the strength of Alentejo, not forgetting of course the sweet wines from Madeira and Porto, which are undoubtedly the best known, if there is something for which Portugal stands out in the wine field it is its enormous variety. This richness is the result of the great climatic and geological diversity of the country, but also the way the Portuguese have managed to maintain a collection of 'castes' or autochthonous grape varieties, all very different from each other —National Touriga, Trincadeira, Aragonez, Alfrocheiro Preto, Rabigato, Loureiro, Baga... to name just a handful— which give rise to a wide range of very varied wines. A whole universe to discover for those who have not yet done so.

Manzanilla, oloroso, fino, dry, pale cream, amontillado... Sherry is a world apart and its names form a jargon of their own. With summer days that exceed 40°C, the capricious whip of the east wind, which dries up the water that it finds in its way, and rains that almost always fall at the wrong time, Jerez does not seem like the ideal place for making wine. And yet ... the secret lies in the albariza, the dazzling white earth of the area, capable of retaining the water of the wettest months and then clamming up in summer, becoming a hard, impenetrable mirror that bounces the sun's rays back, preventing the evaporation of that moisture that was so difficult to come by. This white earth makes it possible to make some of the most varied and appreciated wines in the world, made by mixing different ages of wine through the blending system of criaderas and soleras, giving wines that grow and enrich themselves under the flor that blooms delicately on their surface. These are magical wines, dense with history, different from all others and difficult at first, but impossible to forget once you get to know and love them.

The sound of a bottle of champagne being opened is the sound of celebration, of recent joys or those yet to come. Weddings, birthdays, anniversaries, New Year's Eve, New Year, festivals, sporting triumphs and professional achievements. Champagne is drunk at the beginning of nights that are expected to be memorable and in the middle of others that already are. The question is always that its elegance should highlight the importance of great occasions and intensify the euphoria of the event with the power of its fizz. All this bubbly happiness has become reality against the odds: the Champagne region is right on the edge of the point where wine-growing becomes impossible. Average annual temperatures barely go beyond 10°C, below which the vines can hardly grow, and the area is constantly battered by rain. Fortunately, the chalk soils of the area act as a sponge and drain the water away, while still retaining the humidity necessary for the vines and also helping keep temperatures up. These wines are also the product of the ingenuity needed to find that second fermentation in the bottle which transforms a quiet wine into a magical, sparkling, sophisticated drink, without which, as Oscar Wilde said, pleasure is purely artificial.

The Riesling grape reigns supreme in the vineyards of Germany, the most northerly in Europe, and it slowly ripens from its vantage point on sheer terraces, such as those that overlook the rivers Moselle, Saar and Ruwer, in vines lying in the elusive German sun, seeking warmth on wildly sloping hillsides which are practically vertical. In those abrupt soils of the north it feeds its fine, elegant mineral flavour and its characteristic combination of acidity and sweetness. With the Riesling grape, nothing is too obvious; its smooth skin and the difficult climate of the country will never yield wines of great power, colour or structure. They will not dazzle us at first sight nor tell us everything at the first sip, but they will have a lot to say. Therefore, one must proceed calmly, and take time to get to know and appreciate these wines in all their facets, through long, deep conversations so that little by little this endless range of nuances and delicate flavours, on which the world-wide prestige of this grape stands, can be revealed.
